On Friday morning, we launched the Community Service Project for 2019. All Year 10 students at St Gregory's College are expected to be participants in this, demonstrating not only their willingness to be a part of our community but also a sense of service to others and a sense of a greater good. These Christian values are at the core of Marist education.

The Project outline and log card are attached to this email for you to read and discuss with your son. In Year 10, students are required to complete a minimum number of activities within their family unit (or boarding house unit), the College and the local community. They are asked to complete three activities within their family or boarding unit, two school activities and one community activity. They are encouraged to consider completing more than the minimum allocation. These should be completed before the end of Term 3.

All students who complete the requirements will receive a Community Service Certificate. Those students who complete the project and also hand in a photo journal documenting their experiences may also be eligible for a Community Service Medallion. Certificates and medallions will be presented at an assembly in Term 4. These are a valuable addition to a resumé.

Please note that if your son wishes to be considered for many of the exciting co-curricular events that the College offers, his participation in this Project is essential. Any student wishing to apply for a leadership position in the College or wishing to undertake immersions to Fiji or Solomon Islands with the College must successfully complete the Project.
