

Student Leadership Policy

Source of Obligation	The NSW Registration Manual (3.6.2) requires a non-government school to have in place policies and procedures in relation to the codes of conduct for members of the proposed school community, with specific reference to the role of any student leadership system (or equivalent) in the school and the monitoring of the system.
Our Policy	<p>It is our policy to promote student leadership in our College, in order to foster the values espoused in our Pastoral Care Policy.</p> <p>St Gregory's College Campbelltown recognises that the development of leadership in students is a part of a student's spiritual, intellectual, social, physical and psychological wellbeing.</p>
Aims of the Student Leadership Policy	<p>The College aims to achieve the following outcomes in the Student Leadership Policy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• the realisation of students' potential;• the enhancement of students' self-esteem;• the development of discipline and responsibility in students;• the promotion of College spirit;• a culture of respect and tolerance; and• a sense of pride and belonging in the College and the community.
Student Leadership Positions	<p>All students have the capacity to lead, and are expected to act as leaders at St Gregory's College Campbelltown.</p> <p>The College appoints students to formal leadership positions in the College. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• College Captain;• College Vice Captain;• Marist Solidarity Leader;• Four House Captains;• Four House Sports Captains;• Eight Year Liaison Officers
Student Leadership Responsibilities	<p>Student leaders are expected to display the highest standards of conduct, behaviour and dress.</p> <p>Student leaders are assigned responsibilities from time to time, and are expected to support and uphold the values of the College.</p> <p>These include:</p> <p><u>Student Leaders</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• representing St Gregory's College Campbelltown in the community;• ensuring that students adhere to the Uniform Policy and other College rules;• ensuring the highest standards of behaviour from other students;• organising students within the house;• organising students for sport events and carnivals;• attend Student Leader meetings; and• organising College events.• Lead College assemblies
Monitoring Student Leaders	<p>The College supports student leaders in discharging their responsibilities.</p> <p>After appointment, student leaders will be welcomed in a ceremony, and undergo leadership training.</p> <p>The College will hold regular meetings of student leaders in order to provide support and guidance.</p> <p>A student's failure to discharge responsibilities as a student leader may result in that student being removed from a student leadership position. Refer to our Student Discipline Policy.</p>
Appointing Student Leaders	<p>Student leaders are appointed annually each year by the Leadership Team.</p> <p>Applications are taken at the beginning of Term 3.</p> <p>Students may apply by completing an Application Form, outlining their suitability as a College leader.</p> <p>These candidates will be shortlisted, and interviews will be conducted with shortlisted candidates. The Leadership Team will then appoint student leaders for the following year.</p> <p>Student leaders will be chosen according to the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• demonstrated leadership;• potential leadership;• service to the College community; and• academic and extracurricular achievement.
