## Community Service Project

Community service is an important part of the formation programme for students of St Gregory's College. Along with *Insight* in Year 11, it is an integral part of the *Boys to Men* Programme. As a Catholic school in the Marist tradition, it is important for our young men to put into practice the Gospel values and mission statements which are at the heart of all we do.



### Aims of the Project:

At St Gregory's we hope to

- develop a culture and ethos of service in solidarity with all in our local and extended community;
- provide opportunities for students to exercise responsibility, develop leadership skills and learn through helping others;
- recognise the contribution of students who already participate in service activities in their own time.

### Reasons to Volunteer:

Volunteering has a meaningful, positive effect on any community and on the individuals concerned. It can help individuals to

- give back to society;
- break down barriers; and
- build community while having fun.

Volunteer community service allows one to:

- gain valuable life experiences and skills;
- meet interesting people;
- send a signal to employers by indicating on a resume an individual's commitment, dedication and interests

### How Community Service Works at St Gregory's College

A log card for recording service hours will be distributed to all Year 10 students. It is hoped that each student would reach the minimum expectations before the completion of Term 3.

All students who reach the required number of service opportunities will receive a Community Service Certificate. Any student wishing to receive a Community Service Medallion will need to complete above and beyond the minimum requirements as well as keeping a detailed journal. This should include:

- Photos of the student in action
- Journal entries highlighting challenges, enjoyable experiences and reflections
- Comments from supervisors and parents.

## Boarding Students

As well as being able to achieve hours during the holidays with their own families, boarders will have the opportunity to perform various tasks around the boarding community. These activities can be decided upon in consultation with the Director of Boarding and Boarding Coordinators. Opportunities will be available for both boarders and day students to contribute to other agencies in the local Campbelltown area.

### Expectations:

All students in Year 10 have the opportunity to provide service to the community. There are three categories of service: Family, School Community, and Local Community. Within each category, students will be able to participate in different types of activities.

Students are expected to fulfil a minimum of 3 family, 2 school and 1 community based activity. Students may do more than minimum requirement.

As each activity is completed, the student will be required to fill out their log card and have it signed by the supervising adult. This could be a parent, neighbour, aunt/uncle for family activities or a teacher, boarding supervisor for school activities. In the local Community category, students will be required to set up their own service or volunteer work. These categories will need to be signed off by the supervising facilitator of that organisation. Approval needs to be sought from Mrs Cathie Clarke or Miss Emma Kent to ensure it fits the criteria for the Project.

The log card is to be stored in the student's diary for inspection on request. Progress checks will be conducted throughout the term.

***In order to be considered for election to other programmes within the College, including immersions, leadership and forums, students must have successfully completed the required activities.***

The activities on the following pages are some suggestions on how students may contribute and the approximate length of each activity.
